Singapore-Indonesia Leaders' Retreat: MSE-BAPPENAS Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)

On 25 January 2022, Singapore's Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong met Indonesia's President Joko Widodo for the Singapore-Indonesia Leaders' Retreat. The leaders reaffirmed the excellent relations between Singapore and Indonesia, and acknowledged a list of bilateral agreements, including the MSE-BAPPENAS MoU concerning Bilateral Cooperation on Green and Circular Economy Development. This MoU was first broached by Minister for Sustainability and the Environment Grace Fu and Minister Suharso Monoafa in August 2021 to explore collaboration in resource optimisation, recycling, waste management, and green economy development. Singapore and Indonesia will also be cooperating on broader sustainability opportunities in the coming months for mutual benefit.

Abu Dhabi Sustainability Week

Minister Grace Fu attended the Abu Dhabi Sustainability Week (ADSW) in the United Arab Emirates (UAE) from 16 to 18 January 2022, at the invitation of UAE's Minister of Climate Change and Environment Mariam Bint Mohammed Saeed Almheiri. During the trip, Minister Fu also met with UAE's Minister of Industry and Advanced Technology and Climate Change Special Envoy Dr Sultan Al Jaber; Chairman of Abu Dhabi Department of Energy (DOE) Awaidha Al Marar, Dubai Electricity and Water Authority (DEWA) and Managing Director CEO Mohammed Al Tayer; and Minister of State for Foreign Trade Dr Thani Zeyoudi. Minister Fu and her counterparts from the UAE discussed areas of collaboration in food and water security, renewable energy, and climate action. Minister Fu also reaffirmed Singapore's support for UAE's COP28 Presidency.

The ADSW Opening Ceremony celebrated the winners of the prestigious Zayed Sustainability Prize. Singapore's Wateroam won the coveted prize in the water category for its portable water-filtering device. The device has been successfully deployed in over 38 countries, benefitting more than 200,000 people. The easy-to-use water filters were distributed to healthcare centres, community halls, and other centralised locations where local villagers could fill their buckets with clean drinking water without travelling long distances.

Response to Private Member's Motion on a Low-Carbon Society

On 12 January 2022, Minister Fu spoke in Parliament in response to a Members' Motion on advancing Singapore's transition towards a low-carbon society. In her speech, Minister highlighted that the transition to a low-carbon society will not be straightforward, but can open up a bright, greener future for Singapore. She spoke on how the Government will raise carbon pricing as one of Singapore's emission abatement strategies, leverage carbon markets, and strengthen corporate sustainability. Minister added that the Government would partner all stakeholders – corporates, civil society and the community – to co-create solutions for sustainability, and forge ahead to pursue an effective and inclusive transition to a low-carbon future.
